- There were fourteen civilian fire casualties in 2022 7 minor, 1 moderate, 3 severe & 3 deaths (13 in building fires).
- There were four firefighter casualties in 2022, none were lost-time incident (COVID-19 related casualties not counted).
- There were 561 occupancy pre-incident survey updates and 381 hydrant inspections completed twice during 2022.
- Approximately 2,000 children ages 3 to 9 were educated during October 2022's Fire Prevention Month in 24 sessions.
- There were 218 Fire Inspections completed with 380 Violations discovered and 306 corrected in 2022.
- Fire-Rescue conducted 207 home fire and life safety courtesy inspections and installed 646 smoke detectors in 2022.
- Fire-Rescue's Emergency Operations Center was activated nine times during 2022 for various weather events.
